	PCSO McMillan reported that crime was low in Snodland except for shoplifting crimes that had taken place in the Co-op and the M&S store.
	He also reported on the Speedwatch scheme which is being partly funded by KCC. The scheme involves using volunteers to monitor motorists speeding using a handheld gun. The information is then collated to produce relevant speed warning letters to be sent to the regular offenders. Residents from the Holborough Lakes estate are interested in the scheme but it is recommended that the Council also get behind the scheme. A minimum of 6 volunteers will be needed for the scheme to start. This scheme will be put on the Agenda for discussion at the Amenities and Recreation meeting in January 2017.

The CEO gave examples of John May & Henry Peters Trust Charities ability to provide help and assistance to members of the local community. 10.3 Planning and Environment | 1 December 2016 (pp 64-65) The CEO reported that TMBC had advised that street no 7's name chosen for Holborough Lakes had been changed from Holmes Gardens to Annes Gardens, in memory of the late Councillor Miss A Moloney. It was also suggested that the road named Sloman should also be changed to Chapman in memory of the late Councillor George Chapman. The CEO is to liaise with TMBC regarding the name of Chapman being given to one of the roads in Holborough Lakes. The Chairman suspended Standing Orders 11. Reports from Borough Councillors Cllr D Lettington had been in contact with the Co-op regarding the opening of their new premises at The Bull public house. The reason for the delay is that the Co-op are experiencing problems with the drains and they are in contact with Southern Water regarding this. Rev'd Hugh Broadbent had approached Cllr Lettington to request assistance to help create a footpath leading from All Saints Church, through Churchfields and Holborough Marshes and leading alongside the new Bridge on the West Bank (Snodland side). This land belongs to Tarmac and they have been approached to create a permissive path. A response is being awaited. He reported that the speed sign has been situated on Malling Road which was funded by the County Councillor's Members Grant. He reported that he had been in contact with the Chamber of Commerce regarding the lack of projects being carried out in Snodland. Separately, a meeting has been arranged between the leader of the Borough Council and the CEO regarding the devolvement of funds from the Chamber of Commerce which have not been spent. Cllr Lettington reported that a By-election had been called and was concerned about the costs that would be incurred. The cost is estimated to cost around

£8,500.

The Chairman reinstated Standing Orders. 12. Town Councillors reports on meetings attended on behalf of the Council Cllrs Mr P Misy, D Keeley, Mrs B Keeley, Mrs L Downes, P Hickmott, Mrs S Bell, Mrs D Crook, Mrs D King and Mrs K Mordecai-Woolf all attended the Christmas in Snodland event. Cllr Mrs L Downes reported that she had attended the Allotments Advisory Committee and reported that the fence in the Birling Lands Allotment, which was being fixed by the Committee, had been completed. Cllr D Keeley reported that he had attended the Partnership Meeting. Cllr Mr P Hickmott reported that he had attended the funeral of the ex-councillor, Mr C Miners, and suggested that his name be put forward to the Borough Council for a future street name at Holborough Lakes in his memory. The CEO reported that the donations at the Christmas in Snodland event were, unfortunately, very poor this year. The countdown of the light switch on was also discussed and it was explained that the lights came on automatically and it was very difficult to carry out an exact 'countdown' 13. To receive details of cheques signed since the last Council Meeting The list of cheque payments, direct debits and transfers into reserve account from 28 October 2016 to 30 November 2016 totalling £70,037.89. Various questions were asked which the CEO answered. 14. To present details of the First Draft Budget Draft budget papers for 2017/2018 were distributed to the Committee. The CEO reported that a following a full council meeting held by TMBC on 1st November, Members resolve that from 1 April 2017 the section 136 allocation under the Scheme for the Financial Arrangements and the County Tax Support Grant will cease. This means a loss of funding of £64,377 to Snodland Town Council. At the same meeting, it was resolved to replace the Scheme of Financial Arrangements with Parish Councils with Scheme of Special Expenses. The introduction of Special Expenses will most affect Tonbridge residents (the non-parished area of the Borough) and should see a slight reduction in TMBC'S proportion of the Council Tax bill. The CEO reported that £15,000 has been allocated to the street light renewal project. Also, following a pre-budget meeting with the Chairman of each Committee, where the budget was scrutinised, based on the changes to this budget, it shows an increase in the precept from £256,224 to £287,482. The CEO informed the Committee that the 2017/18 tax base of 3543.42 had been confirmed by TMBC which meant an increase of £6.06 in council tax for Band D households. A list was distributed to the Committee showing the

costings for other Bands.

15. <u>To receive nominates for the KALC Community Award Scheme</u>

The CEO asked the Committee if they had any names to be put forward for the KALC Community Award Scheme. She said that she was proposing to put a person forward for this who had served the community for approximately 30 years. She explained to the Committee that further background information was needed before the application is sent.

16. To consider and if agreed accept proposals relating to funding to provide disabled access to the first floor of the Council building

The CEO reported on the proposals to install disabled access to the first floor function rooms by installing an external lift near to the metal staircase. An indication of cost for the project has been received. Funding has already been agreed from Ms S Hohler (KCC) of £5,000. The Snodland Partnership have also agreed to donate £5,000. TMBC have also provided funding for the town centre via the Chamber of Commerce (which has not yet been spent) – and as local businesses would use the facilities, this could fall under that remit. The CEO to meet with TMBC to discuss this further. The remaining cost would come from the Council's repairs and renewal budget.

RESOLVED – to accept proposals for the disabled access to the first floor of the Council building.

17. Report from the Chief Executive Officer

The CEO reported that the Smurfitt Kappa visit was cancelled again. Another visit will be organised in the New Year.

The CEO informed the Committee that the last working day for the office would be Friday 23 December and would re-open on 3 January 2017. Skeleton office staff will check the post and e-mails on the 29 and 30 December 2016 and site will clear rubbish away that has gathered over the festive season.

The CEO asked the Committee if anyone was interested in getting involved with a community based scheme called 'Mens Shed'. She explained that the scheme's objective is to encourage people to meet up and to get creative.

The CEO finally reported that she had received a joint letter from KALC and KCC asking STC to participate in the Voluntary Support Warden Scheme. The aim of the scheme is designed to work alongside the Kent Community Warden Service and Local Councils. The aim is to improve the community and create resilient neighbourhoods allowing residents to enjoy a good quality of life.

RECOMMEND that this be discussed further at the Amenities and Recreation meeting on 4 January 2017.

18. <u>Correspondence</u>

The CEO reported that she had received a letter from the Mayor of Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council thanking Snodland Town Council for the invitation to attend the Christmas in Snodland event.

Also, a thank you letter had been received from the Heart of Kent Hospice regarding a donation raised by a Councillor's wife.
